



IDENTIFICATION SHEET

Use this identification sheet to correctly identify and tell the differences between orange hawkweed, a highly invasive environmental weed, and broadleaf weeds such as dandelion and cat's ear.

ORANGE HAWKWEED

Pilosella aurantiaca subsp. *aurantiaca*

Multiple clusters of attractive orange flowers, with each 'flower' about 2 cm across.

Rosette leaves are lance-shaped, with upturned edges and long (about 4 mm) simple hairs scattered on both upper and lower surfaces.



CAT'S EAR

Hypochaeris radicata

Single, large yellow flower on top of a solid, leafless stem.

Rosettes are made up of thick, dull-green, toothed leaves covered in short stiff hairs.
